These efforts are commendable, but they are not sustaining. The situation is like giving a hand out to homeless man. No amount of handout can change his/her situation without new orientation. We cannot continue in the current circle of provision and expect a change for public libraries. There must be a new approach to the appalling state. It is therefore very important to get, the stronger attention of the Federal government, the senate and the legislative branch pass a bill that will regularly fund and the establishment of public libraries across the nation. Each state and local government should be encouraged to do more. As a national body we would encourage better public support for the libraries. Friends of libraries Nigeria Chapter believes that the effort to accomplish this should not be the burden of one sector. Success can only be achieved through concerted effort. We are therefore hoping to work with existing local or regional groups in order to amplify our voice in the nation.
